ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
THE SLOOP TAVERN YACHT CLUB

The undersigned, as incorporator of a nonprofit corporation under the provisions of Chapter 24.03 of the Revised Code of Washington, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

ARTICLE 1. NAME

The name of the corporation is The Sloop Tavern Yacht Club.

ARTICLE 2. DURATION

The period of its duration is perpetual.

ARTICLE 3. PURPOSES

This corporation is organized for the following purposes:

(a) To promote and develop informal yacht sailing, racing and cruising, and to provide a good social atmosphere for persons with like interests.

(b) To engage in any nonprofit activity that may lawfully be undertaken by a corporation organized under Chapter 24.03 of the Revised Code of Washington.

(c) To engage in all such activities as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the purposes of this corporation or any of them and to exercise any and all powers authorized or permitted to be done by a corporation under any laws that may be now or hereafter applicable or available to this corporation.

The foregoing clauses of this Article 3 shall each be construed as purposes and powers, and the matters expressed in each clause shall be in no way limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other clauses, but shall be regarded as independent purposes and powers; and nothing contained in these clauses shall be deemed in any way to limit or exclude any power, right or privilege given to this corporation by law or otherwise.

ARTICLE 4. BYLAWS

The Board of Directors shall have the power to adopt, amend or repeal the bylaws of this corporation.

ARTICLE 5. FUNDS AND ASSETS

This corporation shall use its funds only to accomplish the purposes stated in these Articles. In the event this corporation is dissolved, any net assets remaining shall be distributed to The Seattle Sailing Foundation.

ARTICLE 6. AMENDMENTS

These Articles may be amended by majority vote of the Board of Directors at an Annual or Special meeting of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE 7. REGISTERED OFFICE, AGENT

The address of the initial registered office of this corporation is 2830 N.W. Market Street, Seattle, Washington, 98107 and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Wayne Schmidt.

ARTICLE 8. INITIAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS
